

FRUIT TREES, BUSHES, AND VINES

At Maple Hill Nursery and Greenhouses, we have a large selection of plants that produce edible fruit. Following is a list of what we generally have available. All of our apple, cherry, and pear trees are semi-dwarf. Peach trees are naturally 12-15 feet tall and wide.

APPLE TREES

Cortland Zone 4

An excellent eating or pie apple. Ripens later and keeps longer than McIntosh. Blooms mid-season.

Gala Zone 5

Good for fresh eating. Sweet, crunchy, red orange apples ripen in late summer. Blooms mid-season.

Granny Smith Zone 5

Good for fresh eating, pies, and cooking. Tart green apples ripen late season and keep well. Blooms mid to late season.

Fuji Zone 5

Good for fresh eating or baking and keeps well. Blooms mid season and needs a pollinator. The skin color is pink striping over yellow-green.

Honeycrisp Zone 4

Good for fresh eating. A juicy crisp apple with a mild sweet flavor. The skin is yellow with scarlet red stripes. Keeps well. Blooms mid-season.

An old favorite, good for fresh eating and sauce and baking. Ripens in late September. Blooms early to mid-season.

CHERRY TREES

Black Tatarian Zone 5

A black sweet cherry. Good for fresh eating, canning and preserves. A good pollinator.

A red pie cherry. Fruit ripens later in June. Self fruitful.

Large dark red fruit with a sweet flavor. Good for eating, jams, and preserves. A good pollinator.

NECTARINE

Artic-Glo Zone 5

The fruit has white flesh and crimson red over creamy white skin. Self- pollinating. Dwarf.

Red Gold Zone 5

The fruit ripens in mid-August, is sweet, yellow and freestone, the skin is gold with a red blush. Stores well. Is self pollinating. Will withstand urban conditions.

PEACHES

Canadian Harmony Zone 5a

Produces large yellow blushed red freestone fruits in mid to late August. Self-pollinating.

Contender Zone 4

Produces yellow, freestone fruits in August. Flavor is good, tree is productive.

Elberta Zone 5

Produces large golden yellow blushed with red fruits. Ripens in mid-August. Self fruitful. Good for fresh eating, drying, freezing and preserves.

Red Haven Zone 5

Produces medium sized red/gold, freestone fruits of good flavor and texture. Self fruitful. Is reliably hardy. Good for eating, freezing and canning.

Developed at UNH. Produces medium sized, soft, juicy, yellow peaches late July to early August. Self fruitful.

PEARS

Bartlett Zone 5

Produces large golden yellow fruit with good flavor. Good for eating fresh or canning.

Bartlett Max Red Zone 5

A medium sized red skinned pear.

Comice Zone 5

A yellow skinned pear with sweet flavor.

Moonglow Zone 5

A yellow skinned pear with sweet, juicy fruit. Considered to be the best pollinator.

Seckel Zone 5

A small sweet pear, called the “dessert pear.”

PLUMS

Burbank Zone 5

Produces yellow fleshed fruit with yellow skin overlaid with red. The sweet fruit is good for fresh eating, canning and preserves. Ripens in early August. Pollinate with another Japanese plum such as Santa Rosa or Shiro.

Santa Rosa Zone 5

Produces fruit with red skin and deep amber flesh. Best for fresh eating, desserts, snacks, and canning. Self-pollinating, will pollinate other Japanese plums.

A European plum produces blue skinned freestone fruit. Good for fresh eating, cooking, canning and drying. Self-pollinating, will pollinate other European plums.

BLUEBERRIES (Vaccinium)

We carry a large selection of blueberries and try to maintain a good selection of varieties.

Low bush blueberries

Brunswick and Burgundy are 6”-12” high varieties. They make a great groundcover and produce small, but very flavorful berries.

Highbush blueberries

Bluecrop, Bluejay, Duke, Earliblue, Elliot, Jersey, Patriot, and x Pink Lemonade grow to 6'-8' tall and wide producing berries from late July to mid August.

Himrod Zone 5 golden yellow, seedless, good for eating and drying

Reliance Zone 4 pinkish red fruit, seedless, high sugar content

RASPBERRIES

Heritage Zone 4 large red fruit in July, good for eating fresh, freezing, jams

Bristol Black Zone 4 large black fruit mid July

Victoria- heavy producer of thick red stalks, good for pies and sauces

Zone 3 likes sun and soil high in organic matter
